


Luke 2:52 says that Jesus grew in wisdom, in stature, and in favor with God and man. Draw a line to match each phrase with its definition.

Favor with God




Growing Now!

Jesus Went to the Temple

LUKE 2:40-52

Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Passover Festival. This festival was a special celebration to remember how God saved His people from being slaves in Egypt. When Jesus was 12 years old, He and His family went to Jerusalem again.

When the festival was over, Mary and Joseph and those traveling with them left Jerusalem to return home. Mary and Joseph did not know that Jesus had stayed behind in Jerusalem. They thought Jesus was somewhere in their group of travelers.

Mary and Joseph traveled an entire day on the way back to Nazareth before they realized that Jesus was not with them. They looked for Him everywhere. They asked their relatives and friends about Him. No one had seen Jesus!

Mary and Joseph turned around and went back to Jerusalem to search for Jesus. After three days they found Jesus in the temple. He was sitting with the teachers. He was listening to them and asking them questions. All the teachers were amazed at Jesus' understanding and at His answers.

When Mary and Joseph saw Jesus, they were astonished. Mary said to Jesus, "Son, why have You treated us like this? Your father and I have been searching for You. We were so worried!"


