CONVERSATION

God Prepared the Way for Jesus

LUKE 1:5-25,57-80

Zechariah was a priest in the days of King Herod. Zechariah and his wife, Elizabeth, kept all of God's commandments. They were very old and did not have any children.

Zechariah went inside the temple to burn the incense. Suddenly, an angel appeared, and Zechariah was afraid.

The angel said, "Do not be afraid. Your prayer has been heard. Your wife, Elizabeth, will have a son, and you will name him John. He will bring you joy and delight and will be filled with the Holy Spirit. He will help disobedient people understand how to do what God says, and he will prepare the way for the Lord."

Zechariah asked, "How can this be? I am an old man. My wife is getting old, too."

"I am Gabriel," the angel replied. "I stand in God's presence. I was sent to speak to you and tell you this good news. You will now be unable to speak until the child is born because you did not believe my words." And just as Gabriel said, Zechariah could not say a word! Zechariah made signs to the people, but he could not talk.

Elizabeth soon discovered she was going to have a baby. She declared, "The Lord has done this for me!"

After a time Elizabeth had a baby boy. Zechariah took a writing tablet and wrote *His name is John*. Immediately, Zechariah could speak again. He praised God and said, "Child, you will be a prophet of the Most High! You will go before the Lord and prepare people for Him."

John grew up to be a man and became strong with God's Spirit. He lived in the wilderness until the time was right for him to begin preaching to the people.
