

# PASSOVER OR LORD'S SUPPER?



## CONVERSATION

### Paul Wrote About the Lord's Supper

**MATTHEW 26:17-30;**  
**1 CORINTHIANS 11:17-29**

Jesus and His disciples were in Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover feast. Jesus gave instructions to some of His disciples about where they should prepare the Passover meal. The disciples followed Jesus' instructions and prepared the meal.



Jesus knew that this would be His last Passover meal. Soon, everything would change. When His twelve disciples came together that night, Jesus told them He would not be with them much longer. He even told them that one of them would betray Him.

Jesus took some bread. He blessed it, broke it, and gave some to the disciples. He told them to eat the bread and remember His body. Then He took a cup, gave thanks for it, and shared it with His disciples. He said, "Remember My blood which will be poured out for your sins."

The disciples did not understand that Jesus would be crucified. They did not understand that at Jesus' last Passover meal, He provided a way for all of His followers to remember Him.

Later, Paul wrote that Christians should observe the Lord's Supper to remember all Jesus has done for us by dying on the cross and think about Jesus' love for us. The bread reminds us that His body was beaten and crucified for us. The juice reminds us that His blood was shed for us. These symbols remind us of what Jesus has done for us.

When we participate in the Lord's Supper, we should think about all that Jesus has done for us and also think about our own lives. Are we honoring Him in the ways we live? God is ready to forgive our sins when we ask.

#### THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

In today's Bible story your child learned that Christians remember what Jesus did when they participate in the Lord's Supper. Paul wrote to the Corinthians to remind them, and us, that Jesus died and rose from the grave to save us from our sins.
